





Whether you are a die-hard tennis fan or simply looking for a unique sporting experience, the BNP Paribas Open at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden is an event not to be missed. The convergence of the world's best players, breathtaking surroundings, and a rich array of activities guarantees an extraordinary celebration of tennis in Tennis Paradise.





The Thermal Club is set to score another first, hosting the inaugural Thermal Club NTT IndyCar Grand Prix from March 21-23, 2025, the second official race of the season. A showcase of speed and skill, this marks the Club's advancement to

hosting a full championship event.

The weekend at The Thermal Club, regarded as one of the most cutting-edge private motorsports facilities in the world, will be filled with high-speed competition, offering a more intimate experience than, for instance, the Long Beach race vibe. (The Thermal Club race will be held three weeks before the Acura Grand Prix of Long Beach, a traditional race on the West Coast for IndyCar.) This year's race features the biggest names in the NTT IndyCar Series including 2024 series champion Alex Palou (Chip Ganassi Racing), two-time Indianapolis 500 champion Josef Newgarden (Team Penske) and top championship finishers Colton Herta (Andretti Global), Scott McLaughlin and Will Power (Team Penske).

The Thermal Club founder and owner, Tim Rogers, said, "This brings a great event to the valley and makes it accessible to our local residents. It's exciting for them to watch the action without having to deal with the massive crowds that one would experience at Indy 50 with 400,000 fans out there."

He continued, "When fans enter the gates of The Thermal Club, they become aware that we have a world class racing facility right here in the desert."

Spectators can immerse themselves in a variety of culinary offerings from top-tier food trucks to gourmet restaurants, as well as exclusive access to fan zones with driver meet-and-greets, merchandise popups, and unique photo-ops, covering family-friendly spaces to VIP hospitality lounges.

The Club put itself on the on the racing map in early 2024 by hosting the IndyCar \$1 Million Challenge, a non points exhibition March 22-24, 2024. The race was televised on NBC, and while Championship points were not on the line, the event featured a million-dollar purse with the first place award claimed by Spaniard Álex Palou. Palou led all 20 laps of the Sprint for the Purse from the pole, driving his No. 10 DHL Chip Ganassi Racing Honda to a 5.7929-second victory over the No. 3 XPEL Team Penske Chevrolet of Scott McLaughlin, who earned \$350,000 for his runner-up finish.



"The Thermal Club is thrilled to welcome IndyCar back, this time for a full-scale Grand Prix," said Rogers. "Our team has put everything into making this race an unforgettable experience for fans, residents, and guests, in an extraordinary setting that only The Thermal Club can offer."

Rogers pointed out that there are a few changes. "This year we are making sure to give general admission ticket holders access to the food trucks and paddocks. The VIP attendees will have access to pit row which has to be a bit more restrictive for safety reasons."

The race brings its distinctive blend of speed, precision and power to the track's sophisticated Twin Palms track layout, which is a formidable 3.067 mile (4.82 kilometer) masterpiece, packed with 19 thrilling turns, demanding straightaways, sweeping curves, and elevation shifts.

The Thermal Club hosted an evaluation test last November, 2024, for the NTT IndyCar Series teams who put their skills to the test ahead of the upcoming March Grand Prix. Invited media members witnessed an exhibition with participants including Enzo Fittipaldi (Arrow McLaren), Toby Sowery (Dale Coyne Racing), Hunter McElrea (Ed Carpenter Racing), Logan Sargeant (Meyer Shank Racing), Louis Foster (Rahal Letterman Lanigan Racing), and Felipe Nasr (Team Penske).

"The evaluation test was a vital step leading up to the inaugural Thermal Club IndyCar Grand Prix," said Rogers. "Our team has poured heart and soul into crafting an unforgettable experience, all set against the unparalleled backdrop."

When asked if he had any predictions about who will finish first this year, Rogers said, "I want to wait until closer to the race to see who's running fast."

The Thermal Club's entry is through unmarked gates which are tucked between acres of farmland and date palm groves, five miles from the Jacquelyn Cochran Regional Airport in Thermal, California at the base of the Santa Rosa Mountains.

The Club is a posh resort for mega well-heeled (as in average \$30 million net worth each) motorsport enthusiasts who can savor race car action at their doorsteps and from atop their private balconies. First opened in 2013, the Club offers five racing circuits, karting and autocross tracks, designed by Alan Wilson. Each track has its own covered paddock and a full pit crew. The tracks can accommodate any vehicle at any speed, from F1 to high performance exotics to vintage motorsports racecars.

The Thermal Club was established and financed by car collectors and enthusiasts Tim and Twanna Rogers, who amassed their \$7.5 billion in sales by buying and supplying fuel to 7-Eleven convenience stores and gas stations as well as owning Tower Energy Group (as in Tower Markets). The Club provides amenities including a









motorsports village, spa, hotel for guests with 48 casitas, fitness center, tennis courts and a pool.

In order to tear it up on the track as a member of The Thermal Club – either with one's own racing vehicle or with a car ordered for the day provided by The Club – the buy-in is \$200,000 initiation fee, \$2,400 per month membership fee and purchase of a lot with the firm commitment to build a luxury villa within five years, minimum 6,500 square feet. Most homes average 8,000 to 15,000 square feet, while Rogers' is 24,000 square feet. Garages are two and three stories, often with viewing lofts from inside, akin to a modest airplane hangar. There are 276 lots.

Membership includes access to all tracks and amenities. The Club also keeps in the black through its relationship with the BMW Performance Driving Center West lease agreement on the grounds of the Club for \$300,000 per month.

The NTT IndyCar Series, owned by Penske Corporation, is North America's premier open-wheel auto racing series. It features an

international field of the world's most versatile drivers who compete on superspeedways, short ovals, street circuits and permanent road courses. The 2025 season consists of 17 races in the United States and Canada and is highlighted by the historic Indianapolis 500 presented by Gainbridge.

Rogers plans to watch the race from his own patio again this year, before eventually heading out to congratulate the winners.


When asked if he'd like to make this a tradition, Rogers said, "I would definitely want to continue to have this event here...as long as we make money."

Embraces fan excitement and a flexible mindset

#### The Coachella Valley Firebirds forward starts his third year in the pros

For pro hockey player Ben Meyers, life in a transient state is just part of the overall hockey experience.

The forward for the Coachella Valley Firebirds, part of the American Hockey League (AHL), was signed to begin the 2024–25 season in the Coachella Valley in July, as part of his contract with the Seattle Kraken (@SeattleKraken) of the National Hockey League (NHL). He formerly played for the Colorado Avalanche and Anaheim Ducks, prior to which he played college ice hockey at the University of Minnesota. The Firebirds play home games at Acrisure Arena in Palm Desert, California.

Meyers notes, "Anyone under NHL contract can be recalled by the parent team at any time," just as he was recalled by Seattle to play with the Kraken on November 17. Remaining philosophical, he said, "I play where they need me."

Meyers explains that he's been pleasantly surprised by the desert reception since he arrived in the fall. He said, "There's such a strong sense of community and so many fans all over the area. It's great to see the bumper stickers, shirts and hats when I'm out and about. Plus, we get such great crowds at the rink. I can feel the excitement."

Meyers' arrival coincides with the appointment of Derek Laxdal as new head coach of the Coachella Valley Firebirds for the 2024-25 season.

Growing up in Delano, Minnesota, Meyers said, "Hockey is a game I've played my entire life, and I've always had a love for the sport. Playing pro hockey started to become a dream of mine, so my goal was to get a scholarship in college. By working hard, I started to realize that a hockey career was an option. It all happened organically."

Meyers joined the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) University of Minnesota Golden Gophers from the Fargo Force of the United States Hockey League (USHL) where he was an alternate captain and helped the Force win the Clark Cup in 2018. He was named to the Big Ten All-Freshmen Team, and in his sophomore season in 2020–21, he was named an alternate captain, while juggling a major in entrepreneurial management.

In 2021–22, his junior year, Meyers was named the team's captain. He was named to the Academic All-Big Ten, Academic All-District, Second Team All-America selection, 2021-22 Big Ten Player of the

Year, First Team All-Big Ten selection and an NCAA All-Regional Team pick.

In April, 2022, Meyers signed a two-year contract with the Colorado Avalanche of the National Hockey League (NHL), and in March, 2024, he was traded to the Anaheim Ducks.

He was selected to represent the United States in the men's tournament at the 2022 Winter Olympics, alongside teammates Brock Faber and Matthew Knies, where he scored two goals and four points, second on Team USA.

On May 5, 2022, Meyers was named to the United States team to compete at the 2022 IIHF World Championship. He recorded four goals and four assists in ten games.

Acknowledging limitations on his free time, Meyers tries to fit in a game of golf when he can. He said, "I've played golf pretty much my whole life. I really enjoy the Classic Club and PGA West. I'll have more time later, as early in the season it's much busier."

Meyers has learned to live with the fact that his life situation could change at any time, depending on his contract. He said, "Being signed to a one year contract each year means lots of moving around. Plus, I could get traded, so I just have to be mobile. It's a lot to get used to, but I've learned to appreciate the good parts of the job."

When asked about those good parts of the job, Meyers said "I love hockey, and getting to work with teammates is probably the greatest part. Beyond that, I'm getting paid for working out and staying in shape, which is all positive."



Meyers is eagerly anticipating an upcoming visit from his father this spring. He also looks forward to three months off in the summer where he can visit his parents in Minnesota, go fishing and play golf.

Meyers said, "It's not the home I grew up in, because my parents decided they wanted to move. Delano was great, but it's a very small town, and now my parents get to enjoy lakeside living, and when I visit so do I. Plus I get to look after their golden doodle."

He also savors periodic visits with his brother, Nate, who played baseball at Minnesota State University then went into missionary work and is currently enrolled in a masters of psychology program in Colorado.

Asked about his preference for staying put in the desert or moving, Meyers said, "It depends so much on the opportunities. I think I just have to roll with the punches and stay flexible."

Meyers concludes, "One takes the good with the bad." He's possibly hit upon the secret to life for all of us.








The Legends of the Game: The Galleri Classic is a premier event on the PGA TOUR Champions, attracting some of the biggest names in senior golf. Players aged 50 and over compete in this tournament, showcasing their enduring skill, strategy, and competitive spirit. Fans can expect to see legendary figures like Bernhard Langer, Ernie Els, Vijay Singh, and Fred Couples teeing it up alongside rising stars of the Champions Tour.

The 2025 edition promises heightened excitement, with several players competing for milestones and career-defining victories. The event's format—a 54-hole stroke play competition—ensures every round counts, keeping the leaderboard tight and the drama high throughout the weekend.

Community and Charitable Impact; The Galleri Classic is not just about golf; it's a celebration of community and philanthropy. The tournament is named in partnership with GRAIL, a company dedicated to advancing early cancer detection technologies. The event serves as a platform to raise awareness and funds for cancer research and treatment, aligning the spirit of competition with a meaningful cause.

Local charities in the Coachella Valley also benefit significantly from the tournament. Over the years, the Galleri Classic has contributed thousands of dollars to support health initiatives, youth programs, and educational efforts in the region. These contributions make the event a source of pride for the local community, emphasizing its broader impact beyond the golf course.


Whether he lifts the trophy again remains to be seen, but one thing is certain: with Goosen's talent, experience, and the support of those around him, his title defense will be one to remember.





Tohn Henebry was a world-famous golf course photographer whose work captured the elegance and artistry of golf courses across the globe. Alongside his sister and business partner, Jeannine Henebry, John dedicated over 25 years to documenting some of the world's most iconic golf destinations, earning widespread recognition for their breathtaking images.

From an early age, John displayed a passion for photography, a talent that would shape his career. His early adventures took him across Asia, where he trekked the Himalayas of Nepal and India. These experiences exposed him to expansive landscapes and diverse cultures, which fueled his creativity and sharpened his ability to capture stunning visuals. His work eventually earned him assignments with National Geographic Magazine, where he honed his skills in photographing vast terrains, a skill set that would later become central to his work in golf course photography.

John's connection to golf was deeply personal, as he grew up in a golf-loving family. This background, combined with his photographic expertise, enabled him to approach golf course photography with a unique perspective. He not only documented the aesthetic beauty of the courses but also captured their strategic and architectural intricacies. Together with Jeannine, John transformed their shared passion into a successful business, becoming the go-to photographers for renowned golf course designers and publishers.

The Henebry siblings worked with some of the most prominent names in golf course design. They photographed Robert Trent Jones II's designs in exotic locales such as Aruba, Costa Rica, Japan, and Thailand. Their collaboration with Jack Nicklaus took them to Ireland, Canada, India, and Mexico, while assignments for Palmer Design led them to China, India, and Ireland. They also documented Tom Fazio's celebrated courses across the United States for his influential "Golf Course Designs" books.

The Henebrys' work was characterized by their meticulous approach to capturing golf courses. They often waited for the "magic light" of sunrise or sunset, a time when natural lighting highlighted the contours, textures, and colors of the courses. Their patience and precision resulted in images that brought out the unique essence of each course. In 2021, John expanded their offerings by becoming an FAA-certified drone pilot, incorporating aerial photography into their repertoire. This innovation, combined with the use of high-resolution, 100-megapixel cameras, allowed the Henebrys to produce images of unparalleled clarity and detail.

Over the years, their photographs were featured in numerous publications, books, and calendars, solidifying their reputation as pioneers in the field. Among their many achievements, being officially licensed photographers for Pebble Beach Golf Links stood out as a testament to their excellence.

Tragically, John Henebry passed away on January 1, 2025, at the age of 76, following a bicycling accident in Rancho Mirage, California. His untimely death marked a profound loss to the world of golf course photography. However, his legacy endures through the extraordinary body of work he created, inspiring golfers and photography enthusiasts worldwide.

John Henebry's life was a testament to his dedication, artistry, and vision. Together with his sister Jeannine, he elevated golf course photography to an art form, leaving an indelible mark on the industry and the sport.

The Henebry's work has been featured in numerous articles over the past 25 years and all of us at Desert Golf & Tennis and Desert Sports & Leisure will miss John immensely. The world lost an amazing talent, father, son, brother and friend to us all.





Jones is joined by his son, Robert 'Trent' Jones III, Chief Operations Officer, and Bruce Charlton, President and Chief Design Officer, plus an incredible team of talent.

Jones Jr. is the son of Robert Trent Jones, Sr., a venerable figure whose original works and remodels on courses ranging from Peachtree and Spyglass Hill to Mauna Kea and beyond helped characterize the sport.

Having created signature courses on six continents, save for Antarctica, Jones notes "the penguins are waiting." He was inducted into the California Golf Hall of Fame (1991) and has received the Golf Magazine Innovator Award (2009), Asia Pacific Golf Environment Award (2009) and dozens of other prestigious honors. This fall, he will receive the Donald Ross Award from the American Society of Golf Course Architects.

His most prominent projects include CordeValle in the heart of Silicon Valley in San Martin, California; Poppy Hills in Pebble Beach, California (originally designed in 1986 and renovated by the firm in 2014); The Links at Spanish Bay, also in Pebble Beach; Chambers Bay in Tacoma, Washington; Silverado Resort in Napa, California when he was just 27 years old; and Hawaiian gems The Prince, Makai, Poipu Bay and Wailea.

And, Coachella Valley types are well familiar with Rancho La Quinta Country Club in La Quinta, host of the 1996, 1997, and 1998 Skins Games.

Jones has had a big impact in the Far East, with dozens of designs in China, Japan, Philippines, South Korea, Singapore and Taiwan. He has also completed projects in India, South Africa, Tunisia, United Arab Emirates, France, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Denmark, Sweden and Norway. And there are more than a dozen RTJII courses in Mexico and the Caribbean.

Jones created the Hoiana Shores course in Hoi An, Vietnam, which opened in 2020 and features a rare 19 holes. Jones says, "The Vietnamese totally understood what we were trying to do. However, in order to make the Chinese and Hong Kong investors happy, we added an extra gambling hole to drive golfers to the casino there."

The holes have an organic feel, marked not by flags but by red lanterns similar to the ones that famously light up the Old Town section of nearby Hoi An, the historic port city and UNESCO World Heritage Site. The course earned GEO Certified Development status from the golf industry's international standard-bearer for sustainable course design and construction practices—the first in Asia.

Environmental responsibility and sensitivity are indeed core design components. RTJII creates courses with a natural appearance, and they've even remediated long-term environmental degradation with designs that repair and improve the environment.

Active in fighting climate change, Jones has concerns about the current course restoration movement and its emphasis on tree removal, which he says often strays into clear-cutting, with repercussions for all.

But, as he says, "One must take the bitter with the better."

Jones explains, "I never considered myself born into a "golf family." I played competitive golf in my public high school in New Jersey, earning a state title. My mother, a Phi Beta Kappa, influenced me as much as my father did, telling me to be the best at whatever I did. I was the only one in my high school accepted into Yale, where I made the golf team, and mom told me not to worry, that the girls would find me later." With a chuckle, he says, "And they did."

Jones considered his dad's job a cottage industry, so he set out to be an attorney, studying at Stanford University Law School. He ended up switching gears before graduating and apprenticed with his dad for 10 years. After running west coast operations, Jones expanded into Asia with solo international efforts.

One of his earliest experiences was working alongside his father on the legendary Spyglass Hill Golf Club in Pebble Beach in the 1960s. Jones recalls, "We were trying to replicate Pine Valley in New Jersey by recreating the wide, spacious fairways and large greens. For a golfer on the wrong side of those contours, being down two putts can be difficult."

He became active politically by attending the 1968 Democratic National Convention in Chicago and today considers himself a political pragmatist working with both sides. His collaboration with U.S. Senator Alan Cranston in the 1980s led to a partnership with Dr. Armand Hammer to design the first ever course behind the iron curtain, with the ascendance of glasnost and Mikhail Gorbachev.

He explains, "We were working in the Soviet Union where the

food was bad and the vodka was worse. Dr. Hammer wanted the course named after him, but we learned the only way they do that is if you are dead. So, Dr. Hammer compromised and said he'd take two lifetime memberships." After years of high stakes negotiating, the course opened as the Moscow Country Club.

During the COVID 19 pandemic, Jones and his wife, Claiborne, found themselves at their family home in Princeville at Kauai's Makai Golf Club, a design project which started with his father and became the first job he completed on his own in 1971 and renovated in 2009.

For over a year, many of his days were occupied by golf and painting sessions with neighbor Pierce Brosnan, whom he describes as having a delightful personality and a good friend. At one point, Vice President Kamala Harris and her husband Doug Emhoff were out on the course, and they all teamed up, secret service in tow.

One of his favorite recollections is from one day when the Bond actor came up short on a shot and exclaimed, "Bobby, you are the architect of all my joys and my sorrows!"

In addition to being a lauded author ("Golf by Design: How to Lower Your Score by Reading the Features of a Course," Little Brown and Co. 1993), one of Jones' passions is poetry. He has authored a book of poems which he updates once a year on his birthday in July and prints out 50 copies to give to close friends and family. His observations of life range from light to serious pieces, and he puts emphasis on the syllable count and rhythm. His works are illustrated graphically by Kim Lyle. The book may be found online at https://poetryandgrass.com, a gift which he generously shares with the world for free.

Jones says "All my courses are symphonies with dominant themes. They have crescendos and lulls. There are different rhythms, you can feel the changes. I try to design golf courses that will fascinate people, so they'll want to play them many times and learn the depths and meanings of the courses' stories, their subtext, their poetry."

He continues, "The three most dangerous words in golf are 'greens committee chairman.' The attitude of most people who try to redesign courses is that it's a party. Our attitude is it's a game. I want to make it interesting for young people to play, not necessarily harder, but not so simple that it's not interesting."

Jones brings layers of strategy to those who play his courses, challenging mental as well as physical consciousness for anyone willing to do the work. It's clear that his guiding force is the pursuit of excellence.

Perhaps he sums it up best himself by saying, "I'm a long-term player. I never give up."

Perhaps his ethic is best summed up with his statement, "Treat people how you want to be treated. Only you can share your truth."


